

Brexit Briefing January 2017

Welcome to this month's update on the latest Brexit developments and their potential impact on the careers guidance community from Euroguidance UK.

The State of Brexit 6 Months On

The end of 2016 marked 6 months since the UK shocked many by <u>voting to leave</u> <u>the EU</u>. Whilst politicians across Europe have waited to hear more about the UK's plans, Theresa May and her government have been very careful not to give too much away, rarely straying far beyond the <u>Brexit means Brexit</u> mantra.

However, there has been some progress in the last 6 months. The referendum has largely moved debates beyond *if* the UK will leave the EU to *how* the exit will play out. This is a subtle but crucial shift and it means all stakeholders should now be focussed on what they want from Brexit.

We also know that the UK Government plans to trigger Article 50 and begin the formal process of leaving the bloc by the <u>end of March 2017</u>. Although the exact process required to do this is still to be defined (more should be known once the <u>Supreme Court rules</u> on the Government's appeal against <u>needing parliamentary</u> <u>approval</u> in early January), it again seems unlikely that there will be much – if any – delay to this plan.

Once Article 50 is triggered the UK will have two years to negotiate its exit - with a
